

EXCEPTIONAL TEMPORARY EMERGENCY AID (ATE)

Pensioners born in 1959

Exceptional Temporary Assistance (**Aide Temporaire Exceptionnelle – ATE**), set up in 2012 by the Board of Directors, is a CRPN social welfare measure. **ATE** provides assistance to pensioners temporarily faced with a reduced income. This assistance is means-tested.

On June 25, 2015, the Board of Directors fixed the conditions under which the system applies for pensioners born in 1955 and later.

Pursuant to this decision, the exceptional temporary assistance system for pensioners born in 1959 is as follows:

ATE eligibility conditions

The **ATE** is targeted exclusively at direct pensioners having claimed all their flight crew pension entitlements before 1st January 2012 and who have not reached the minimum age to claim the basic old-age pension mentioned in Article L. 161-17-2 of the French Social Security Code.

To CLAIM THE **ATE**, you must:

- ⇒ have reached the age of 60,
- ⇒ have claimed all your CRPN pension entitlements before the age of 60 and before 1st January 2012 (effective date).

Your household income (excluding CRPN pension supplement) must not exceed a certain limit (indicated on page 3).

Procedure for claiming the ATE

The **ATE** is not paid automatically. It is means-tested, awarded after receipt and examination of the pensioner's application. When the conditions are met, it is paid in two payments, and each one must be applied for separately. The eligibility conditions for **ATE** are assessed in each application.

⇒ **When should I submit my ATE application?**

Each complete **ATE** application must be sent by the deadlines indicated on page 2:

- ➡ *for the first payment, from 1st September of the year of your 60th birthday,*
- ➡ *for the second payment, from 1st September of the year of your 61st birthday*

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⇒ What documents should I attach to my ATE application?

Your **ATE** application must comprise **each year**:

- the duly completed application **form**, dated and signed (<http://www.crpn.fr/telechargements>);
- a copy of the last **tax notice** of your household,
- your **individual basic old-age pension employment record**, dated no earlier than June of the current year, or your basic pension notification (if you have since claimed your basic old-age pension). ⇒ What are the deadlines for sending my ATE application?

We recommend that you **send your ATE application from September**, when you have received your tax notice from the tax authority.

Pensioners born in the first half of the year must send their **complete** application between **1st September and 31 December: applications must be postmarked this date or earlier.**

Pensioners born in the second half of the year must send their **complete** application between **1st September and 30 June of the following year: applications must be postmarked this date or earlier.**

After the deadline corresponding to your half-year of birth, your application will no longer be accepted and the assistance that could be due to you for that year will no longer be awarded.

Dates of sending applications according to the applicant's half-year of birth (generation year 1959)

*Example: for the first payment, if you were born in October 1959, you must send your **1st application** between 1st September 2019 and 30 June 2020, attaching your tax notice covering 2018 income received in 2019, on the basis of which the **1st calculation** is made. For the second payment, you must send a **second application** between 1st September 2020 and 30 June 2021, attaching your tax notice covering 2019 income received in 2020, on the basis of which the **2nd calculation** is made.*

Determination of the gross amount of the ATE

⇒ **The ATE is awarded on a means-tested basis**

The ATE is calculated each year from the reference taxable income, the size of the household (shown on the tax notice attached to the application), and the amount of CRPN supplement received up to the 60th birthday. The annual income limits above which **ATE** is not awarded are as follows:

Single person	30,400 €
Couple, or single with one dependent	45,650 €
Supplement per dependent	6,100 €

⇒ **Amount of the ATE**

The amount of the ATE is proportional to the number of months between your 60th birthday and the minimum age at which you can claim your basic old-age pension[☒] or, where applicable, the date on which your early pension is notified to you for long career or disability.

The maximum number of months is defined in reference to the 2011 Pensions Act (cf. Article L. 161-17-2 of the SSC) which provided the progressive raising, beyond the age of 60, of the minimum legal age of entitlement to the basic old-age pension.

For your generation, this age has been raised to 62, which corresponds to a **maximum deferral of 24 months** above the age of 60.

⇒ **The maximum amount of the ATE is fixed at €355 per month of pension age deferral**

The **maximum** ATE is therefore 24 times €355, which is **€8,520**.

⇒ **The amount of the ATE is awarded on a sliding scale according to income**

The amount of the ATE is also capped at the amount of the last monthly supplement, multiplied by the number of months of pension age deferral. Below €10, the ATE is not paid.

⇒ **The ATE is subject to the mandatory social deductions and income tax**

☒ Social Security (CNAV), Social Security for the self-employed (RSI), MSA, CAFAT (New Caledonia), CPS (French Polynesia), etc.

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Determination of the amount paid

⇒ **The ATE will be awarded through two calculations and 2 payments**

The ATE is calculated and paid in one instalment in 2020 (in January if you were born in the first half-year, in July if you were born in the second half-year), on the basis of your income for the year 2018 shown on your tax notice received in 2019. It is calculated and paid a second instalment in 2021 (in January if you were born in the first half-year, in July if you were born in the second half-year), on the basis of your income for the year 2019 shown on your tax notice received in 2020.

⇒ **The date of each of the two payments depends on your half-year of birth.**

As your pension age deferral is a maximum of 24 months (generation 1959), you will receive, in January or July depending on your half-year of birth, 2 payments each corresponding to 12 months of the amount of ATE calculated. The payment dates are as follows:

ATE payment date for generation 1959

Half-year of birth	1st payment of 12 months (tax notice of 2018 income received in 2019) paid end	2nd payment of 12 months (tax notice of 2019 income received in 2020) paid end
1 st half-year	January 2020	January 2021
2 nd half-year	July 2020	July 2021

Example: a pensioner born in March 1959, whose calculations for the two applications (according to income and household size) result in the maximum amount of ATE, would receive:

- a 1st payment of 4,260 € (12 x 355 €)
- a second payment of 4,260 € (12 x 355 €)
- which is €8,520 in total

Don't forget to complete the form, attach your tax notice and evidence of your basic old-age pension, and send your completed application by the deadlines set.
